From the Priests

This is my 12th Christmas here at St. James. As I do every year, I want to thank all those who give so much of themselves to help us celebrate in our worship the coming of God among us. All who decorated the church, cleaned the church, everyone who put all that time into rehearsals for the music for Mass, all our liturgical ministers: Altar Servers, Eucharistic Ministers, Ushers, Lectors and those who helped with child care. At a time of the year when people have so much to do---our parish is blessed with people who give more time than usual to their parish. A number of people have helped out at more than one Mass in order that all can flow smoothly for all of us. This means people gave up part of their Christmas with family and friends. As I said last weekend at Mass, that truly is part of the Christmas message---giving of ourselves for others. Let us be mindful and grateful for all those who inconvenience themselves so that others can approach their God in prayer.

In my role as the priest here, I am often aware of pain and hardship that people carry privately. This Christmas I am conscious of people in our parish who have heavy burdens and much anxiety in their lives. To you I say: I am in awe of your faith. Although you carry your crosses privately, you witness to the true message of a God who came into human lives, and called people beyond the horizons, the boundaries that hemmed them in---in you truly “the Word is made flesh, and dwells among us.”

I also find myself grateful for all who make the message of Christmas a message lived out every day of the year here at St. James. Whether it is giving of yourself on one (or more!) of the many committees listed on the front of the bulletin, visiting the homebound, participating in one of the support groups, helping our young people grow in faith each week in the classroom, being part of the parish outreach to those who have economic hardship, providing meals when requested---and in so many other ways---*daily* Christ is a real presence in and through our parish. The old song asks: “Why can’t every day be like Christmas”---*well it is*—in actions seen and unseen....
