 blew the wind in April.**

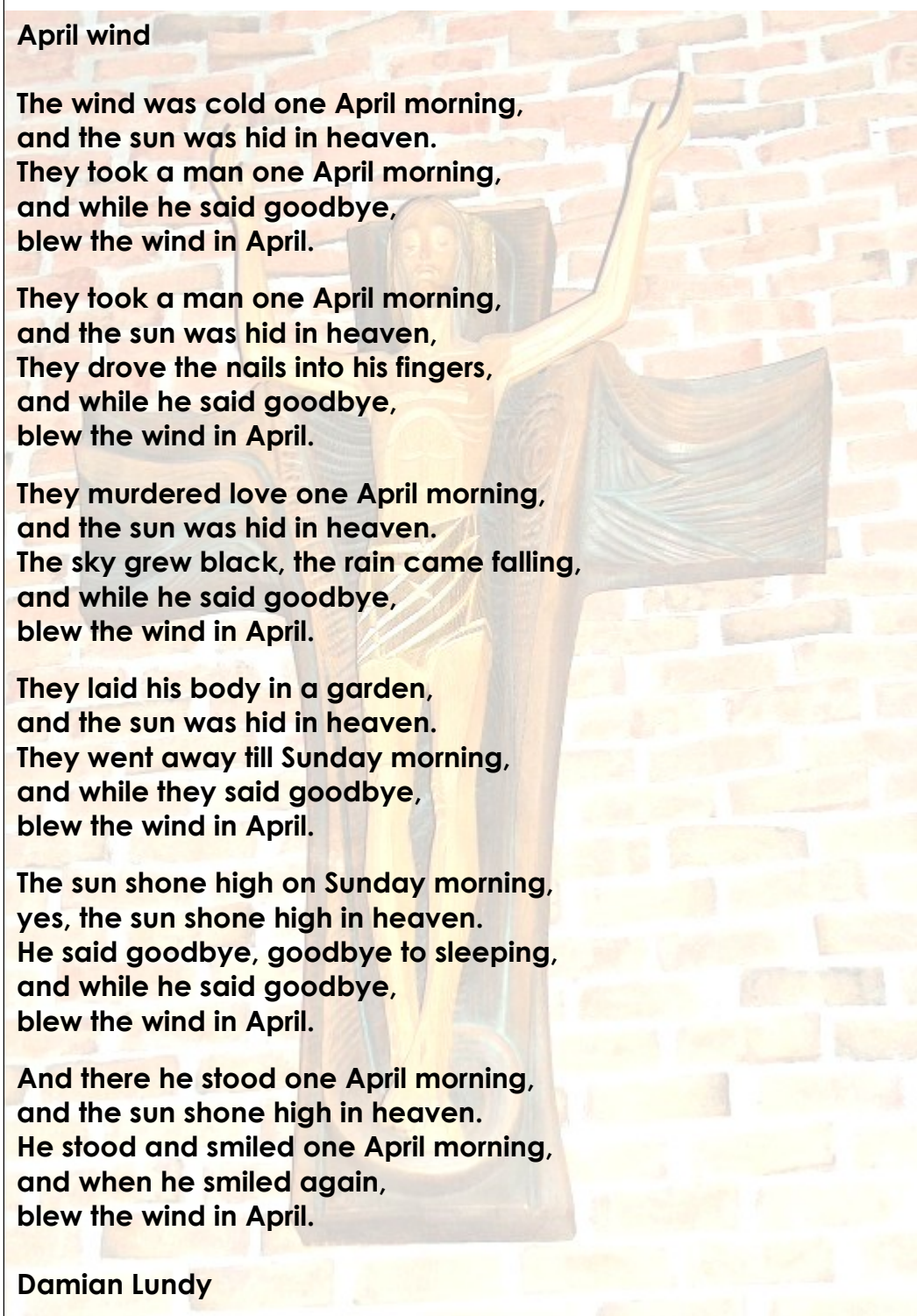
**And there he stood one April morning,

Once again our parish has journeyed through Lent. We had our own personal rituals and reflection time, we had many different gatherings as a parish, and we were joined with God's people throughout the world.

Once again the **Lenten Soup Suppers** were a positive experience. This year our presenters were from local agencies and groups that had received funds from our parish tithe. It really gave us an awareness of the good that is accomplished when we as a parish give to others. It also helped us grow in awareness of the many needs here in Madison County. Our **Stations of the Cross** each week gave us different ways to reflect on the Lord's journey and our own.

Our **Evenings of Recollection** "Christian Self Love," with Jim Krisher "Sabbath," and "Stories" with me were nourishing experiences, (if I say so myself!).

Having **Daily Mass** twice a day allowed more people to work it into their schedules. Our numbers grew as Lent progressed. (Often it is the other way around).

We have had a long hard winter but that did not deter many of you availing of the different activities that the parish offered.

With the lengthening of days, activities are changing. Our Religious Education classes will be winding down over the two weeks.

Our **Parish Capital Campaign** continues to bring support to our parish projects. As of this date, we have received \$850,000 in actual donations. Thank you all so, so, much. Our parking lot and walkways were all replaced this past year. Work on the grounds will get underway shortly.

Church Hall partitions (after almost 40 years of being put up and down weekly) will be replaced this summer

Our week to week budget continues to be a bit of a challenge. Thank you all for your faithful support of your parish.

You are reading this *after* our Holy Week observances, I am writing this **on Holy Thursday** morning---so I say in advance: Thanks, as always, to those who were able to help out during these sacred days to provide such a special environment for our prayer. Thanks also, to all who shared their gifts in liturgy, music, serving in the sanctuary, and in proclaiming the Word. Thank you to all who came to St. James and shared worship with us. We are *all* lifted up when we pray together.

The BIG local parish news is, of course, that you will shortly (July 1st) be welcoming a new pastor: **Fr. Kevin Corcoran**. I know his coming here will be a great experience for him as it has been for me these past 12 years. He and I have met a couple of times and I can assure you he will be a great "fit" for this parish.

As most of you know I have a 6 month sabbatical, most of which will be spent studying in Sydney, Australia. After that....I haven't a clue. Only the Holy Spirit knows—and that has worked fine for most of my past 34 years as a priest.

My prayer is that life continues to be an uplifting experience for you as it has for me in all my years here in Cazenovia.
