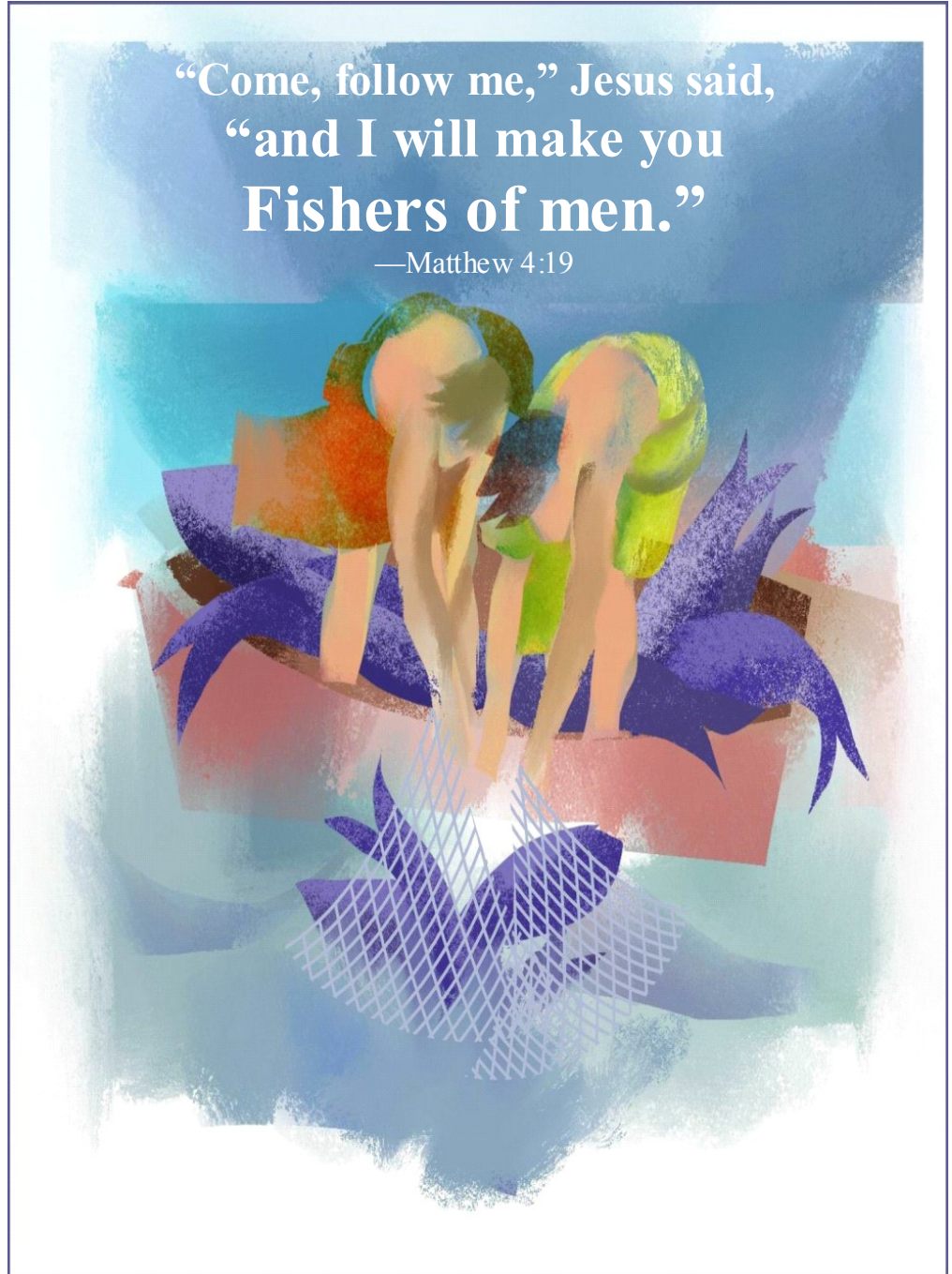

A note from Father Kevin

In the story of this weekend's Gospel, James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John are called by Jesus as they worked by the Sea of Galilee as fishermen. They joined Peter and his brother Andrew who followed Jesus just moments before to become "fishers of men."

St. James, the namesake of our parish, was known at the time that followed the resurrection of Jesus for the energy and passion that he gave to living and proclaiming his faith. We continue to live our faith in that same tradition as each of us makes a contribution to the life and spirit of our parish.

The idea of "making a contribution" may seem more obvious to those in the parish who give of their time and talents in outward ways. Many of you spend time teaching in the Religious Education program. Some of you serve on the Pastoral Council, give time to one of our important working committees or serve in one of our liturgical ministries. But everyone, even if your life only allows your attendance in church, makes a contribution. What this means is that every parishioner is equally important to what makes up our parish. Together, with many individual contributions, we respond to the call to serve Jesus.

A critical part of what we share and how we serve is how, together, we support the parish financially. Now, before you read further you may hear your inner voice saying: "Okay here we go, it's the "money thing." Make no mistake, it is a financial request, but giving financially is the fuel that keeps the engine of our parish life vibrant and moving. It is also something that is very much tied to what happened in the days of the apostles and the early church.

And that is that people gave of what they had to ensure that their faith communities would not only have the means to serve them and others in the challenges of life, but that it would have a solid foundation to serve for years to come.

Next weekend, as I help the parish reflect on what we give to the parish community, I ask that everyone keep that history in mind. Financial giving, like all the other ways that people so generously give, is a vital part of our Christian tradition and its effectiveness.

I understand that everyone's financial situation is different, especially in these challenging times. Only you can answer whether or not you can increase your giving, or whether or not you can begin a giving practice. But know that the combination of everyone's gift, however great or small, will ensure our success in meeting a real need.
